News From Ireland and Elsewhere

- A small group of young people in Ireland organized the *Rosary on the Coasts for Life and Faith* on Sunday, November 26th to pray the Rosary and ask God to intervene in the movement to decriminalize abortion on the Island. The event was modeled on *Rosary to the Border* events in Poland and Italy. Fifty three stations were planned (one for each Hail Mary of five decades) however, due to the overwhelming participation of nearly 30,000 people the group had to expand to more than 300 different stations. The event is estimated to be the largest gathering of Irish Catholics at a religious event since the 1979 visit of St. Pope John Paul II.
- The Ireland-Northern Ireland border is proving to be a key and troubling aspect of the British government's plan to exit the EU. Prime Minister Teresa May was forced to align herself with the DUP in Northern Ireland after her poor performance in the forced national elections this year. She faces pressure from her new allies to develop a unionist solution to the issue. December 14th is a looming date when a key EU summit on Brexit is scheduled. Pressure is on May to develop a solution that will not impose a hard border, for to do so will severely affect the economy of both sides. Stay tuned.
