
Major and Shamrock Degree in Albany

News From Ireland and Elsewhere

- Cash for Ash, a scheme in Northern Ireland which allowed for a £1.6 credit for every £1 spent on "green" heating systems has been revamped after a farmer started heating an empty shed to reap the ridiculously generous reward. The plan was corrected in late 2015, but people are still benefiting.
- Ford Motor Corporation will hold a number of events in 2017 to celebrate the centenary of its 1917 plant in Cork. The last Model T ever produced by Ford rolled off the Cork assembly line in December 1928. Henry Ford's father, William, emigrated from Ballinascarty in Co. Cork in 1847.
- Limerick mother Aine Laffan cooked up a New Year's Day storm when she delivered her son Odhran on the kitchen floor at 4:23 am. Ambulance arrived at 4:33 am. Mother and son are doing fine.
- Patrick Pearse's handwritten surrender letter which marked the end of the 1916 Rising was purchased at auction in 2005 for €800,000. The unidentified owner attempted to auction it off in December, but when bidding stuck at €770,000 the owner withdrew the letter. The Minister for Arts, Heritage, Regional, Rural and Gaeltacht Affairs subsequently signed it into the Register of Cultural Objects – a tome of records held in Killarney – preventing the unidentified owner from taking it out of Ireland. The owner does not live in Ireland.
