In some sectors of the community March is being hailed as Irish American Heritage Month. What better way to actively celebrate your Irish heritage than by marching in a parade. This year the Division will be marching in three parades: New York City on the 17th as part of the Orange County AOH, March 16th in the Mid-Hudson Parade in Goshen, and March 23rd in the Village of Wallkill Parade. All members in good standing are invited and encouraged to march in one or more parades. Haven't marched before? A bit unsure of who to talk to or how to go about it? Don't have a green AOH jacket? No problem, no problem, no problem. The solution: decide to march, call the Hall and ask one of the officers for more details, stop by on a Friday to speak with members who have marched before, and borrow one of the many spare green jackets at the hall. We have parade items for you to borrow so you will fit in with other marchers. It is a truly amazing feeling marching down the parade route being cheered on by so many people. You might even spy a loved one or friend on the sidelines cheering for you. Actively celebrating your Irish heritage-one of the best ways to keep our race alive.

## Parade Details

Sunday March 16th - Mid-Hudson St. Patrick's Parade. Line-up at the Government Center parking lot in Goshen at 1 pm. The parade steps off at 2 pm and makes it way through Goshen ending back at the Government Center. Pre parade events: 9 am Mass at Our Lady of Mount Carmel, Middletown; 10:30 am Grand Marshal's brunch at Kuhl's Highland House, \$20 p/p,

Monday March 17th - New York City St. Patrick's Day Parade. We have rented a bus for easy travel. Sign up at the Hall-\$35 per person. Bus departs from Loughran's Pub in Salisbury Mills (Rt. 94) at 8 am sharp! Come early and enjoy a hearty Irish breakfast. We form at 11:15 am on east 44th Street between Madison and 5th Avenue. Please be on time. As the parade is on a Monday this year we are hoping that members come to NYC and march. Orange County AOH has won the best AOH marching unit award for the past few years which lets us step off early in the line of march the next year. Come march and help continue the winning tradition.

Sunday March 23rd - Wallkill (Ulster County) Village Parade. Line up at 1 pm at the Wallkill Middle School (Rt. 208). Parade steps off at 2 pm ending at the Wallkill Fire Department (Central Ave. & Main St.)
