Bobby Sands, MP died on hunger strike in Long Kesh prison on May 5, 1981. during the prison protest that would forever change the direction of the Irish republican movement. The purpose of the strike was to achieve the reintroduction of political status for Irish republican prisoners of war. Special category, or political, status would be achieved if five demands were met: the right of prisoners to wear their civilian clothes at all times; the right to free association within a block of cells; the right not to do prison work; the right to educational and recreational facilities; and the restoration of lost remission of sentence. From his prison cell at age 27, Bobby Sands won a seat in the British Parliament, receiving more

votes for office than then British Prime Minister Margaret Thatcher, becoming the youngest MP at the time. Two weeks later, he died after 66 days without food. Bobby Sands' death sparked rioting across Ireland, with over 100,000 people attending his funeral in Belfast. Nine hunger strikers would follow him to the grave, but not before catapulting the Irish republican movement into the international spotlight, paving the way for future peace agreements and thrusting republicans into mainstream Irish politics, where Sinn Fein now stands the largest pro-Agreement party in Northern Ireland, and is currently the third largest party on the island overall. Bobby wrote poetry, short stories, a poignant account of what the prisoners suffered (One Day in My Life), and kept a diary for the first seventeen days of his hunger strike in which he wrote:

"Our revenge will be the laughter of our children"
