The biggest celebration of the Irish is Saint Patrick's Day. Patrick was a missionary who brought Christianity to Ireland. Patrick was also an archbishop and one of the patron saints of Ireland. His feast day is celebrated by Catholics all around the world.

Saint Patrick's Day is a national holiday in Ireland. Schools in Ireland have the day off because of this. There are a lot of Irish people living in America. 
