
By the time O'Neill took command of the Fenian Field Army, Major General Sweeny's original plan for a three-pronged attack had been considerably diluted. Logistical issues had rendered the Chicago advance unfeasible. The Fenians in Cleveland (O'Neill's regiment among them) had not been provided boats to cross Lake Erie into Ontario. As a result, the Cleveland force was transported by train to Buffalo and consolidated with the units there (who had sufficient boats to cross the Niagara River). Sweeny's 16.800-man force that was to attack Lower Canada from Vermont, commanded by Brigadier General Samuel P. Spear, numbered only around 2,000 and had significant communication issues with the Buffalo unit. They would not play a decisive role in the events that unfolded. Sweeny had planned to overwhelm the British with three forces converging on them at once, forcing them to fight in multiple directions simultaneously and preventing them from massing on any one portion of the Fenian Army at a given time. Though absolutely sound in concept, as illustrated above, the plan fell apart in execution; O'Neill and his men would face the bulk of the Crown forces alone.

At this point, it is useful to stop for a moment and look at what role the US government had in the unfolding drama. As illustrated earlier, the government was well aware of the Fenian Brotherhood – recruiting had occurred openly

during the Civil War and Fenians had fought in the ranks of both Union and Confederate armies. The US government had condoned the movement (if not encouraged it), largely out of resentment at England's support of the Confederacy. There is historical speculation that, prior to the invasion, Roberts had even met with US President Andrew Johnson and informed him of the Fenian's plan for Canada – receiving Johnson's assurances for official US recognition of their accomplishments if they were successful. Though this exchange is largely unconfirmed, Roberts exuded supreme confidence in "official" US support for the planned invasion and subsequent negotiations for a free Ireland. Something served as the rationale for this confidence; the US government made no serious attempt to disarm or arrest the Fenians prior to the invasion, although little effort had been made by the Fenians to be discreet in their activities. The participants in the failed Campo Bellow expedition were let off by US authorities with mere slaps on the wrists. This would lend credence to Roberts' allusion to official support. On the other hand, a US Navv gunboat, the USS Michigan, appeared in Buffalo harbor on the night of 30 May and began to patrol the Niagara River, prepared

prepared to intercept the invasion force as they tried to cross into Canada. The seemingly contrary behavior of the government would become clear a few days after O'Neill advanced into Canada.

O'Neill, now an acting Brigadier of what was being called the "Irish Republican Army," moved his men from various assembly points located in warehouses around Buffalo to the docks on the Niagara River. At 0315 hrs on the morning of 01 June, the invasion began as the Fenians loaded barges and, evading the USS Michigan, were towed across the river by steam tugs. The first to reach the Canadian shore were Fenian units from Kentucky and Indiana, under the command of Colonel Owen Starr. Starr moved his force to capture the remnants of an old Crown outpost known as Fort Erie. Resistance was light – only 6 soldiers from the Royal Canadian Rifles had been left to defend the fort – and Starr's men soon raised an orange, white and green tricolor over the outpost.
