Saturday - 8 am to 9 am, Meile Failte
9 am to Noon, A Thousand Welcomes
Noon to 1pm, Thistle and Shamrock (celtic music)

Sunday - Noon to 4 pm, Ceol na nGael

If you miss a show you can always go to WFUV.org and listen to the archived shows. It's almost like TiVo for Irish music fans. And with a little help from a techie friend you might even be able to have your Irish internet radio pumping through your home stereo system. Now that would be awesome! Happy listening.
