News From Ireland and Elsewhere

 Ireland's Central Statistics Office is seeking a change in EU law that will allow it to use roaming data from mobile phones to help compile tourism data. Slovenia, Austria, Belgium and Greenland have all begun first steps to start using mobile positioning data for tourism purposes.

- An Olympic ticket scandal has resulted in a Brazilian judge ordering the seizure of passports from Football Association of Ireland Chief Executive John Delaney and five others. Police believe tickets for athlete's family members were funneled to a British company for resale.
- For the first time in 80 years Manchester United's first-team squad does not have a player from Ireland. Strong Irish immigration to Manchester has kept United, who were almost called Manchester Celtic in 1902, closely aligned with Ireland. It was Paddy McNairs transfer to Sunderland that closed the door, hopefully temporarily.
- Late night TV host James Corden joined others in supporting the Twitter campaign (@twowomentravel) of two Irish women who were traveling to the UK to have abortions. The campaign is addressing the tweets to Taoiseach Enda Kenny in the continuing national debate on abortion.
- The Kennedy Summer School in New Ross, Co. Wexford, hometown of JFK's ancestors, will cover the topic of political conversation this year and include an appearance by Governor Martin O'Malley, former U.S. democratic presidential candidate.
